2. Centre Improvement / Plans

Court front walls - Kane advised that he will continue to patch the front walls at present, as funds are not available to do a full re-plaster of the walls. Kane advised that the Masters Squash have been approached for a contribution towards the kitchen and the Tennis Club are also going to contribute.

Focus for the remainder of the year for the committee is the complete the work on the patio area.

3. Calendar of Events

AGM is scheduled for 7th September, all committee members encouraged to continue next year, aim is to recruit a few more members for next year.

10. Sponsorship / Shirts

Blue Gum won 2nd prize in a competition from our shirt supplier, and as a result we have a \$200 credit for our next order. We are going to place one final order for shirts to use this credit, and have a small stock available for purchase.

11. Juniors

Juniors continued this term with numbers being around 15-20 participants. Several juniors have joined the club, and their details have been updated.

We discussed that the pathway for juniors at our club is really via the Wednesday round robin at the moment, and Thursday in-house, before pennants. There may be other opportunities developed along the way, but these are our current staple options.

WA Squash are planning to do a metro promotion of squash through schools in the Brentwood / Hilton corridor in the next 12 months, so we need to plan for how to incorporate more juniors into our club. This is currently being hampered by a lack of staff available to run the school programmes, see discussion about WA Squash for more details.

12. SportyHQ - for pennant players

The Squash Matrix had ceased and all teams / results / rankings are now on SportyHQ.

13. Community Fundraising Box

This initiative is currently on hold, and may commence later in the year.

14. Masters Squash

Centre Improvements - Steven had written to the Masters Committee (President & Treasurer) and asked them to consider a regular contribution to the club to support the ongoing improvements to the centre. It was suggested that \$1000 per year may be appropriate. At this stage no response has been received.

WA State Masters Championships - congratulations to Wesley Emery for winning his age group at the championships

15. WA Squash - forum to discuss fees / budget

Steven attended a forum held by WA Squash to discuss the current financial situation of WA Squash and to get an idea of what the member clubs would support in relation to fees. The forum was attended by around 10 clubs, including 3-4 country clubs.

WA Squash fees need to increase as they haven't changed since 2014. The current fees barely cover the costs of running the association, and fees to Squash Australia. There is also going to be a reduction in Sport & Recreation funding in 2021 which will see \$20,000 removed from the budget. The number of players is reducing and the ongoing costs are increasing.

The immediate issue is to generate enough revenue to keep the association solvent. In order to do this, the registration fees need to increase. Several options were presented and after discussion at the forum the following options were supported by the member clubs.

Option 1 - Metro Snr - \$70, Country Snr - \$50, Junior - \$40 (this is an increase of \$20 per year for all categories

Option 2 -Metro Snr - \$80, Country Snr - \$50, Junior - \$50 (this would provide a further increase which would provide a bigger buffer)

There will be a discussion paper circulated to clubs, to provide to members, as these options will be voted on at a Special GM in October.

The second part of the meeting was to discuss what services are needed to develop squash in WA, and who is best placed to provide these, ie Squash Australia, WA Squash, the member clubs, or the centre managers. There will be some notes distributed to clubs for further feedback and discussion. The concept of how all people playing squash can contribute to the funding of squash, rather than just those who are WA Squash registered was introduced for us to think about. For Blue Gum this would equate to currently around 80 WA Squash members, out of 120 club members, but out of closer to 150-180 people playing squash at the centre.
