Minutes

1. Centre Improvements

Discussion - 2026-27 Projects

Committee discussed what the next project could be to improve the centre. We have looked at air-conditioning and updating the changerooms as part of a larger scale project but have not been able to progress this due to the cost being very high. We discussed whether these projects could be broken down into smaller pieces and completed in stages, and if so, what would be the priority.

For any of these projects we would need support from the Centre (Mike), the Tennis Club, and the City of Melville.

Changerooms

- Could be split into 3 areas - Showers, toilets and change area
- Some funding may be available to support female facilities, usually not for male
- Club member may be able to supply materials at cost price
- Aim to leave the layout the same, but update all tiles, fixtures and fittings, including privacy screens
- Need a clear plan so that it can all tie in together if done in stages

Air-conditioning

- Look into options that can possibly be expanded over time
- Focus on heating / cooling the club area initially

Plan - for both projects

- next 6 months - arrange for some quotes / options to be developed with costs so that we can decide how best to approach this
- email Mike, and the Tennis Club to ascertain what level of support may be available

4. Grants

April 2024 - Play Our Way Program - this is a federal grant through the Dept of Health and Aged Care aimed to promote equitable access, build more suitable facilities, and support grassroots initiatives to engage women and girls in sport and physical activity throughout their lives. There are two focus areas - (1) Facilities - safe, accessible, inclusive and welcoming, and increased useage, (2) **Participation and Equipment - Organisational delivery, quality of programs and support, access, increased involvement across all areas of club development.** Projects must be completed by 30 June 2027.

Oct 24 - we have been successful with our program grant - \$22,500 per year for 3 years, see separate item for discussion

Jun 25 - First year of funding has been received and allocated.

4.1. Play Our Way Grant - Programs and Equipment

The club has been successful in our funding application for programs and equipment to support women and girls to engage in squash, and to encourage them to remain attached in some way. The funding is significant - \$22,500 per year for three years, so we want to use this in the best possible way. Louis had drafted an outline of how this program, named FutureSquash, will operate as a starting point. We will have a sub-committee to manage the grant activities which will include:

- Advertising and promotion of squash, the centre and the club

- Development of management group, gain feedback from players, parents and interested people, focus groups
- Development of materials, websites, baseline data and programs to support the grant
- Introducing Come and Try days, women's/girls competitions, womens / girls only sessions, coaching
- Exploring motivational guest speakers
- Partnering with Squash WA, Fuel to Go and Play, Squashworld Brentwood and local council

Overall aim is to increase the number of women and girls playing squash at our centre, and as club members, provide opportunities for women and girls to participate, and make it easier for women and girls to engage in our sport. We will also be aiming to increase representation at our club and provide opportunities for women and girls to develop further skills in the sport, either via coaching, development pathways, or officiating.

 - WhatsApp group to be established to promote Social Squash and other events, connect women together - COMPLETED
- Follow approved activity plan
 - 1:1 coaching - vouchers to be provided in packs
 - Guest speaker presentation - Discussing with Squash WA, aim for June 2026 - deferred to 2026-27 FY
 - Supporting girls / women to undertake qualifications - Coaching, Refereeing
- Women's Forum - Saturday 31st January (10.30am to 11.30am) - COMPLETED

Financial Year - 2026/27

Initial plans for this financial year.

- Come & Try days - every two months for remainder of 2026, aim to continue in 2027
 - Sunday afternoons seem to popular, so will run in that timeslot
 - Jul - Sunday 26th - 1.00pm to 2.30pm - COMPLETED
 - Sep - Sunday 20th - 1.00pm to 2.30pm
 - Nov - Sunday 22nd - 1.00pm to 2.30pm

- Support for State representatives - funding to attend Nationals, coaching support - \$1000 per person allocated (3 x girls)
- Support to grow Womens Social Squash - vouchers to attend, and for coaching
 - Survey participants to seek feedback on what is working and suggestions to improve
- Support to grow female participation in club, and Squash WA
 - Possible sponsorship of West Coast Open if held at Blue Gum
- Creation and delivery of Womens forum in conjunction with Squash WA - to be finalised
- Final year of funding
 - Louis has a report to submit for 2025-26, will do so next week, Steven to provide stats and budget
 - Case studies to be identified for final report - suggested (1) Clarke girls, (2) Women who have come onboard, (3) juniors who have joined, now playing tournaments

5.4. Merchandise

Discussion around future merchandise

- Louis shared a draft design based on our current 'branding' for consideration. Overall feedback was positive
- Discussed that the next run should be for 50th anniversary merchandise, have this ready to go for January, and sell throughout the year. Louis will look at a draft for this
 - Question - did we want to include an open for sponsors to be on the shirt, or just have a 'clean' shirt
 - Pros - sponsors pay \$500 each for their logo, brings down the cost per shirt when selling, maybe higher volumes
 - Cons - may distract from the celebration of the 50th anniversary

Junior shirts. All junior members will receive a shirt as part of their membership in 2026.

The club will be promoting the **Level 0** refereeing course for ALL PENNANT players in 2026. Ideally this would be a pre-requisite, but realistically it is about motivating players to be more confident and consistent when having to referee matches as part of the pennant experience. The Level 0 course is a free, basic introduction to the rules of squash. Designed for players, coaches, referees, squash enthusiasts, and parents, this course provides an excellent opportunity to learn more about the sport of squash.
