## **Minutes**

## 1. Bills Received / To Pay

## 2. Centre Improvement / Plans

Flooring - the whole centre has now been carpeted, which looks great. The door on court 8 isn't closing properly, Kane to be advised, as the door closer is currently not connected, which may fix the issue.

Outdoor area - the BBQ has been purchased and has been constructed, it works very well! Rob has enclosed the end patio area, and is currently designing some cupboards to surround the new BBQ..

Court front walls - Steven to email Kane get an update on what the current plan is to fix the walls.

#### 3. Calendar of Events

Events planned:

State League (home game) - Tuesday 14th May

Family Day - it was agreed that the next event would be held on a Saturday afternoon, with squash games, followed by a sausage sizzle. The aim would be to encourage juniors, members and casual players to come down for a hit, and low key social function. Tentative date is the first Saturday of term 3 - 27th July, from 2.00pm onwards for squash, sausage sizzle around 5.00pm.

## 4. Membership

We currently have 107 members @ 13th May

Members from 2018 who have not renewed have been contacted and encouraged to join the club in 2019.

Fees are up to date, but we have three of the State League players still needing to pay their fees.

#### 5. Pennant Teams

Pennants for Autumn 2019 are coming to a close, with Grand Finals this week..

We have 13 teams entered this year in night pennants - 4 Monday night, 7 Tuesday night, 2 Ladies Tuesday night.

We have had 7 teams make the finals this season. Grand Finals for the 4 team draws were held last week, we had three teams competing but unfortunately all came second. We had three teams competing in semi-finals, with two wins and one loss, so this week we have three teams competing in Grand Finals - one at Blue Gum, two are away.

We have a State League entered under the club name. The State League will be playing at Blue Gum on Tuesday 14th May. We agreed that this is a great opportunity to promote squash locally, and we will use these dates as a mini event. The State League is currently sitting in second position with four rounds to go. Finals for the State Grade are scheduled for June / July.

Autumn Day League has also commenced, the following Blue Gum members are playing - Ali Butler, Cathy Wilson, Greg Mills, Natalie Arrindell, Wesley Emery, Bob Vivian, and Lynne White. Day League finishes at the end of May, with finals in early June.

### 6. Website - bluegumsquash.org

Steve has updated the logo on the website, and added our current sponsors.

The website has been useful for new players locating our club, with several enquiries being generated since it has been up and running.

Hosting has been extended for three years.

## 10. Sponsorship / Shirts

As at March we have six sponsors, four are new and have providing funding for the shirts, and the outdoor area. All sponsors details are on display at the centre, have been advertised on Facebook, and the newsletter. Regular updates will be provided on all on our platforms.

The initial shirt order has been received - 55 ordered - and are currently being worn around the courts. A second order of 21 shirts was made at the end of April, and should be received around the end of May. Cost is going to be subsidised by sponsor funds - 1 shirt (\$20), 2 shirts (\$50), 3 shirts (\$85).

## 11. Juniors

Juniors has started up again this term with numbers being around 15-20 participants. Some juniors are also linking into the Wednesday night round robin, which is great to see. Several juniors have joined the club, and their details have been updated.

We discussed that the pathway for juniors at our club is really via the Wednesday round robin at the moment, and Thursday in-house, before pennants. There may be other opportunities developed along the way, but these are our current staple options.

WA Squash are planning to do a metro promotion of squash through schools in the Brentwood / Hilton corridor in the next 12 months, so we need to plan for how to incorporate more juniors into our club.

## 12. SportyHQ - for pennant players

The Squash Matrix had ceased and all teams / results / rankings are now on SportyHQ. There have been a few teething issues, and these are slowly being worked through at club and WA Squash level, but it appears that the first season may be a little messy.

#### 13. Community Fundraising Box

Steven raised the question of whether the Centre and the Club could jointly support a donation box for collection of change for local community projects, or charities. We could also look at doing a fundraiser once a year for a specific reason, as has been done in the past with Purple Bra day.

The initiative was supported but needed to be discussed with Kane as the box would need to be located at the front counter.

This initiative is currently on hold, and may commence later in the year.
