1. 2023 - Goals for the club

Membership - aim to keep our current members and increase our membership numbers to 225. We currently have 199 members for 2022.

- ensure we retain our current members, what is needed to keep people at the club, why do people leave?
- target Murdoch University students as a cohort of potential new players
- target casual players and try to 'convert' them to club members, and ultimately WA Squash participants Kane will ask centre staff to promote benefits of joining the club to all casual players, particularly those who play in the evenings
- target populations, ie females, to try and increase representation we will do this via the Girls Squash Program
- target our Juniors and encourage all junior program participants to join the club via Junior Program, Junior pennants, tournaments
- ensure the 'pathways' for social players are available, clear and advertised -Wednesday social, Thursday in-house, tournaments
- offer free coaching, for new adult players to help improve their skills and enjoyment, maybe once or twice a month agreed, need to start this initiative.

7. Girls only squash coaching

We have set aside \$2000 to fund the running of the following program three times during 2022:

- Run a six week "Squash Girls Can" program in Terms 2, 3 & 4 2022

- **Term 2** has been completed - *6 girls, 2 courts, 1 coach* (Sue Hillier) - cost = \$360 Sue less \$360 fees received, Kane has donated the court hire, so Term 2 was cost neutral to the club

- **Term** 3 has been completed - **7** *girls, 2 courts, 1 coach* (Sue Hillier) - cost = \$360 Sue less \$420 fees received, Kane has donated the court hire, so Term 3 was cost neutral to the club

- Aim to increase coaches, add Hannah for **Term 4**, and then double number of participants, program has been advertised at all local High Schools for Term 4, commences November 3rd to December 8th

PLAN - 2023

- Limit the participants to maximum of 16, over four courts, with three female coaches

- Participants can be teenage girls, their mums, adult women, any females wanting to learn to play squash (check with coaches)

- Aim of the program is to develop skills as social squash players, and link into further development options

- Costs, Courts (\$20 x 4 x 6) = \$480, Coaches (\$60 x 3 x 6) = \$1080 = \$1560, Fees, \$10 per week x 16 = \$960 - NET COST \$600 per term

- Will keep on a Thursday afternoon (4.00pm to 5.00pm) to keep consistent with 2022, and other junior coaching

- Tentative Term Dates:

a. Term 1 - 23rd February, & 2nd, 9th, 16th, 23rd & 30th March

b. Term 2 – 18th & 26th May, & 1st, 8th, 15th & 22nd June

c. Term 3 – 3rd, 10th, 17th, 24th, & 31st August, & 7th September

d. Term 4 – 2nd, 9th, 16th, 23rd & 30th November, & 7th Dec

- Club will continue to seek grant funding to support this initiative as well

8. Grants

Mar 2021 - TAB Sports Grants - \$2000 towards equipment for the Junior program - ongoing

Apr 2021 - Volunteer Grant (via Federal MP) - **SUCCESSFUL** - \$5000 received in January 2022, funds to be used by December 2022.

Grant expenditure to date is as follows:

- Coaching Course fees 2 x \$165, 1 x \$55 = \$385
- Access to Club Management resources via Clubmap = \$493.90
- Bag Racks 2 x \$169 = \$338
- Chairs (Chairforce) 50 x \$49 + delivery = \$2570.00
- Tables aim to purchase 4 new tables

To purchase (\$1213.10 remaining) - tables. Steven to organise purchase of tables prior to the end of the year.

NB - we have signed up to Green Chair, which is a company that offers free excess furniture to non profits groups, so we may be able to pick up some tables from this source, or other furniture items that may help the club.

June 2022 - Budget Direct Sponsorship - application made for \$2500 for juniors, girls program and equipment (UNSUCCESSFUL)

September 2022 - Australian Sports Foundation - \$970 - for equipment to support growth of junior programme (PENDING)

September 2022 - Volunteer Grant (via Federal MP) - \$5000 - to update technology, coaching fees - advised that \$2000 has been allocated to the club for coaching equipment - looking at spending this on a Smart TV / GoPro to allow us to live stream games, access coaching videos and websites etc. Money should be available in January 2023. (SUCCESSFUL)

October 2022 - Fuel to Play and Go - \$2000 grants available to promote healthy food and drink options, application made. (PENDING)

Potential Grants:

Community (federal) - Larger grant available to support front wall upgrade, waiting for further information from Sam Lim's office.

Facilities (state) - Twice a year to support the upgrading of playing surfaces, looking at this for a third of the front wall costs.

9. Facilities - improvements

The ongoing development of facilities is critical for the future of squash in WA, and as the largest 'users' of the centre, the club is committed to the continual development of our centre for the benefit of members, all squash players, and the wider community. The current

focus of the club is to work towards a permanent solution for the front walls in conjunction with other key stakeholders. This and other items are listed below.

Option 1 - Front Walls - aim to upgrade to glass

- CourtTech Australia currently supply and install glass front walls over old plaster walls, the cost per court is \$23,000
- COURTDesigns HALF SYSTEM Renovation is a permanent solution to reoccuring front wall and side wall problems. COURTDesigns offers renovations for plaster courts and panel courts. *5 year guarantee *Low maintenance, same surface at the professionals *Height adjustable tins. After installation of the 40mm thick COURTDesigns Half System Wall on existing plaster walls, the court dimensions still comply with WSF guidelines

- 8 courts = \$184,000, DLGSC Funding \$61,000, Balance \$123,000
- 4 courts = \$92,000, DLGSC Funding \$31,000, Balance \$61,000

Option 2 - Front Walls - quote from Lenzo Plasterers

- Initial quote to patch the walls, render, and paint \$8,800 per court = \$71,000
- Next quote replace full walls (club remove) \$16,000 per court = \$128,000
- Next quote replace full walls (they remove) \$18,000 per court = \$144,000

Option 3 - Front Walls - quote from Adept Building / Mike Millington

- Initial 'quote' was around \$10,000 per court = \$80,000, using club labour to remove old walls
- Looking at splitting into three sections 1-2, 3-5, 6-8 as will need to block off to avoid dust going through the centre
- Mike & Rob to develop a 'spec' for the plaster, court plaster is available from the UK, Mike's plasterer to give a more detailed costing
- Need to have a formal quote provided by the end of November

Meeting held (23rd March) with Bill Thomas (BGPTC) & Kane Fasolo. Bill is on the board's capital expenditure committee and was seeking input into the needs of the squash centre. Following is a summary of the discussion:

- Facilities funding is available via DLGSC twice a year, maximum of 30% of total project
- Tennis club access this funding, so looking at what projects to prioritise in the next couple of years
- Front walls were discussed, reason for needing repair, what done in the past, why glass not replaster, costs involved
- City of Melville unlikely to contribute, have not provided any funding to Tennis club for any improvements to date, only loans
- If the club could raise funds to fix one court, that would be seen as favourable. We will look at options to raise funds.
- Will need funding from club, Tennis, Local and/or Federal Government, and possibly private funding to get this project completed
- Look at starting with most damaged courts, and/or doing the upgrades over a few years
- Steven to contact DLGSC to discuss our project, and provide details to Bill

Steven spoke with DLGSC, Mark Toomath (9492-9870), he advised the following:

- Project to upgrade the front walls to glass was within the funding scope
- Need to ensure Tennis Club is on board (as lease holder), letter to that effect or joint application
- Need to contact City of Melville, get their approval to support the work, discuss their priorities, as likely to have several applications at each local Government
- Maximum funding is 30%, so need to have remaining funds allocated to the project, and clearly documented
- Need to talk to WA Squash to ensure this project is on their priority list as well
- Next funding round is in July/Aug, funds need to be spent by 15th June 2023
- Application should highlight the benefits of the upgrade, to community, players, in terms of reduce maintenance costs etc

Further follow up with clubs in Victoria, and Squash Australia has occurred. Professional opinion has been sought on the best avenue to take for 'fixing' the front walls. Further discussion to be held on this issue.

Louis has made contact with Ben Morton's office to seek support for this project and we are in the process of trying to secure funding via an election commitment, or a future grant round. Further clarity on this will be available following the federal election in May.

21/5/2022 - Following the Liberal loss and Ben Morton losing his seat, our funding for this project has now gone, and we need to start again.

4/8/2022 - Frank has organised a quote from a plasterer as part of our ongoing discussion to fix the walls. Details to be provided in the next week. The issue of the leaking roof is still to be resolved.

6/8/22 - met Ole from Tennis Club, he advised that the council had repaired the roof, and the leak over court 7 should now be resolved. He was checking to see if any further rain had entered, advised that we would monitor this.

12/9/22 - Kane advised that the City of Melville has inspected the roof and have declared that all the leaks have been fixed, and that the downpipes are sufficient for drainage from the roof. Kane will get this in writing so that we have some comeback in the event of any future work being affected by water damage.

12/9/22 - Mike to put together a detailed quote to replace the front wall plaster with a specification plan that will ensure the correct materials are used now and in the future. Club to seek funding via Federal MP, State Grant, and Tennis Club.

14/1/22 - Further quote from Lenzo Plasterers received to replace the whole front walls, rather than patching

Floors - approval has been provided by the City of Melville to sand the floors, as per an agreement following the roof leaks. Kane is following this up. These have been scheduled for August 2022.

September 2022 - sanding of the floors has commenced, two courts per week over the next four weeks, only court 4 to complete

Air Conditioning - Kane put this onto the agenda for the capital expenditure committee. Plan is to place two units at either end of the 'clubroom' area to create a flow into the central space. Options and costs are being explored.

Air flow / Fans - The club is looking to replace the downstairs door (by the fountain) with a dual door (\$650) that can open and provide a screen door to allow air flow. Kane has installed one fan in the downstairs area to increase air flow.
