Minutes

1. 2024 Committee Meetings

Following the meeting with Mike Corren, the committee meetings will continue to be held more every third meeting in person at the club, and Mike to be invited to attend.

2024 Meeting dates - 17th Jan (club), 14th Feb (online), 13th Mar (online), 10th Apr (club), 8th May (online), 12th Jun (online), 10th Jul (club), 14th Aug (online). AGM 14th Sept.

2. Priorities for 2024

The committee met with Mike to discuss his plans for the future, and how the club and Mike could together to continue to improve the facilities, promote and grow squash, build participation at centre, membership of the club, and involvement in Squash WA events.

The meeting was productive and it was agreed that Mike would be invited to attend a committee meeting each quarter so that we could continue to develop our relationship but could meet as throughout the year.

A summary of the discussion was as follows:

- Mike's plan for the business in the next 2 months
- Aim is to grow participation in squash, how do we get more people into the centre (keys

how do we convert more people to join the club, how do we get more people involved in WA events (pennants & tournaments)

- Facilities - what needs to happen to make our facility the best it can be, needs to be well and attractive to players, needs to be visible, needs to be well maintained, contemporary friendly, clean, tidy and inviting.
- What are the priorities of the club / Mike / Squash WA - need to come up with a list and for next 12 months
- Club - we want to be Blue Gum Squash Club, not a copy of another club. We need to develop identity, and build our club profile around this. What do we have to offer that others don't would people choose to join our club?
- Stakeholders - the club is the biggest stakeholder for the centre, but we also need to include Squash WA, Blue Gum Park Tennis Club, City of Melville, State and Federal Member of Parliament, who else?
- Missing - some form of centre based competition for new players. Wednesday night round has almost ceased, so can something be developed in its place. Juniors - some schedule for junior members to come and play for a nominal fee, say \$5 per person for an hour - couple of time slots a week, during off peak times, maybe Saturday morning before the Thursday afternoon after school.

Summary of committee discussion since meeting in November, and at this meeting.

Facility:

- Finalise the front walls, as many courts as we can do with the funding we received
- Paint the remaining court walls so our courts are all up to date by June 2024 – Mike C has idea of coloured walls, as a means of standing out in the industry – pastel colours
- General tidy up and clean up of the centre – dust, clutter, repair anything broken, remove furniture, organise noticeboards, update electronic display, etc
- Ensure that the facility reflects a good business standard - it should be inviting, professional, easy to locate and access, have excellent customer service and have clear and concise information readily available
- Fit new door downstairs to allow air flow during summer - Rob Blackett
- Is there a way to open up the door at Eastern End to allow for air flow as well?
- Ensure maintenance issues are reported and repaired as soon as possible, especially those as they impact playing environment
- Upgrade the Men's change room / toilet
- Air conditioning - what are the options
- Ensure facility has a range of pictures on display, male / female, young / old, some diverse boys club vibe at present
- Staff / players to take some responsibility to empty bottle / recycle bins, not just the club mostly)
- Question - could we support the funding of a commercial cleaner to do a one-off 'spring set the standard'?

Centre:

- Continue to employ Junior coach and run a Junior program, maybe expand options for junior members to play at certain times for \$5-\$10
- Offer a range of 'programs' to encourage new players to the centre, improve skills of casual players, convert casual players to in-house events, and club membership
- All staff to promote the existence of the club and benefits of joining to non-members

Club:

- Create promotional material to advertise the club and benefits of membership to non-n
- Explore merchandise options to promote the club – Jacket / Hoodie, stubby holder, next shirt?
- Improve our level and style of communication with members, and potential members
- Increase our junior membership, support the junior program, find a junior co-ordinator coaches
- Continue to offer a Club Development Squad in 2024 – look at how this might expand to talented players, ie U11
- Run several in-house events across the year to attract players in competition – Doubles, Teams event – either afternoon, 1 day, or evening/day event
- Ensure our website, social media, and general communication is welcoming, attractive and at our target audience
- Increase our level of volunteers within the club
- Provide social events for members and families to join in, eg bowls, 10 pin bowling
- Ensure our committee is as effective as it can be, explore weaknesses and address these, our strengths, allocate roles to committee members
- Do we need to focus on enticing girls / females into the club / game as a priority

Relationships:

- Establish link with City of Melville – particularly around maintenance needs
- Connect with State and Federal members – ensure they know we exist, grant options
- Continue to work with Squash WA to develop the game, promote involvement in Squash WA/ help grow participation at all levels

Discussion around roles that the committee needed to fulfil in order to keep the club running, all committee members should have a role. Steven to circulate a list of roles and some role descriptions for discussion.

Roles needed at the club - President, Secretary, Treasurer, Club Captain x 2, Media/publicity/sponsors/newsletter, Govt liaison/grants, social events, merchandise, maintenance/repairs, junior co-ordinator, membership.

Committee to allocate roles for next 12 months.

Secretary role is vacant, main duties are to organise and document the meetings. No volunteer meeting for the role.

Newsletter - Steven will send out the final newsletter for 2023. We may move to Mailchimp for details to be explored.

4. Membership

Membership - priorities for 2024 - We finished with 203 members for 2023 (209-2022)

1. Aim to keep our current members - membership renewal to be sent out this week.
2. Work with Mike to increase participation at the centre and convert casual players to club members
3. Aim for all juniors participating in the Junior Program to join the club, term fee will be tied to membership

Club membership runs out at the end of December so we will be encouraging all existing members to renew for 2024, and then work with Mike to increase membership numbers.

Summary of 2023 membership - 203 members

- Total - 203 - 10 (Life), 113 (Squash WA), 80 (club only) / 49 (25%) female / 154 (75%) male
- Senior - 179 - 10 (Life), 98 (Squash WA), 71 (club only) / 32 female / 147 male
- Junior - 24 - 15 (Squash WA), 9 (club only) / 17 female, 7 male

4.1. Membership - Juniors

We finished 2023 with 24 juniors members (15 Squash WA, 9 club only) (50-2022).

The junior program has an average of 25 juniors each week, and runs during school term

Last term we ran a beginners court, two courts for Club Development players (aim to get up for WA talent squad selection), and five courts of general coaching. This appears to be well, and we will review for 2024.

If we expand our Junior Program and options, then we are going to need more coaches. support any person who is interested in attending a coaching course and helping out, as the committee if you are interested. Next coaching course is scheduled for January 2024.

We've had some recent interest in new kids joining the program, and we do receive referrals from Squash WA from kids who have attended a school clinic and receive free vouchers if the survey. These referrals often don't result in kids attending, so we follow these up directly next term.

Transition from SportyHQ to MySquashAus has commenced, all current registered players have updated their profile on the new system. System will come live for registrations from 24th August, and for competitions by the end of the year. At this stage we are looking at this only managing the players competing in WA Squash competitions, but it can cater for casual and in-house players as well.

All current players registered with Squash WA are covered until 30 June 2024. Fees for future years will increase next year, and will be collected directly by Squash WA, via a link provided by the committee. Compete - this is for any players competing at a National Level

Local - This is for any players competing at a State Level - pennants, tournament etc - most of this group

Lifestyle - This is for club members who would like insurance coverage, can reserve for penna before needing to upgrade

Social - Probably not a category that would be used, aimed at non-competition players **(this may be deleted)**

Support - For those who are in a support role and what to keep connected to Squash WA and Aus

Digital - Free option for all players at any level to keep in touch with what it happening

Most of players will fit into the LOCAL or LIFESTYLE category, fees are increased from \$70 / \$40 to \$110 / \$44. There will be benefits attached to some memberships (Squash TV for Compete and Local) discounts, which are still to be determined.

10. Squash WA - Masters

Steven met with Squash WA in relation to Masters squash being managed by Squash WA in the present WA Masters Squash (WAMS) manages most of the Masters squash in WA. WAMS originally started as a sub-committee of WA Squash and incorporated about three years ago into its own. At the recent Squash WA AGM, WAMS requested to become affiliated with Squash WA, however the member clubs weren't supportive of this occurring, as it creates a precedent for other groups to be separate, and the ultimate aim is for squash in WA to be united in its approach.

Masters squash is the biggest demographic of players. BGSC has 119 registered players with Squash WA. 97 (80%) of those are aged 35+, which qualifies for Masters, so it is vital that these players have a particular focus on their needs and participation.

Squash WA has put together a Masters committee and is applying to manage the 2025 Australia Championships in Perth. Ideally this will be done in conjunction with WAMS, and further discussion will be held in this regard.

Further information about Masters competitions for 2024 will be advised soon. Masters categories will be included in all major Squash WA events, are already included in many country tournaments there will continue to be Masters only tournaments held locally.

11. Girls only squash coaching

12. Grants

October 2022 - Fuel to Play and Go - \$2000 grants available to promote healthy food and drink. Application made. Waiting for meeting with Healthway to final grant. Grant of \$1600 offered to waiting for payment. (SUCCESSFUL). Funds have been received and will be spent over the next months to support the Fuel to Play and Go message. Had to replace the Water Cooler so these funds will be allocated to this or towards the new fridge. Steven to request approval to use the funds for this purpose.

July 2023 - Facilities (state) - Twice a year to support the upgrading of playing surfaces, looking at a third of the front wall costs. For 2023 this grant can now be for up to 50% of the cost of the project. Application made via the Tennis Club for \$110,000. We should know the outcome of this grant by the end of November at the latest. **(Application SUCCESSFUL - full amount - \$110,000)**

August 2023 - Volunteer grant - new round coming up - new fridge, tables, benches, bag storage application made for \$5000 (Aug 23). Advised by Sam Lim we have been 'approved' for \$3000, finalise the grant application with the Federal department this month. Funds won't be available until 2024, to be spent in the next financial year.

Potential Grants:

Community (federal) - Louis will contact Sam Lim's office to try and 'find' some funding for the Community Centre. The Lim's office contacted to arrange a meeting to discuss the following:

- Infrastructure Grant - paint walls, bathroom facilities, air con - discussion with Sam Lim's office. A letter detailing our needs has been provided, waiting to hear back from his office.

13. Facilities - Court renovations

The ongoing development of facilities is critical for the future of squash in WA, and as the large of the centre, the club is committed to the continual development of our centre for the benefit members, all squash players, and the wider community. The current focus of the club is to work a permanent solution for the front walls in conjunction with other key stakeholders. This and c items are listed below.

Grant Application - Front Walls - aim to upgrade to glass (SUCCESSFUL)

- CourtTech Australia currently supply and install glass front walls over old plaster walls, t per court is \$23,000 +GST
- COURTDsgns HALF SYSTEM Renovation is a permanent solution to reoccurring front w wall problems. COURTDsgns offers renovations for plaster courts and panel courts. * guarantee *Low maintenance, same surface at the professionals *Height adjustable t installation of the 40mm thick COURTDsgns Half System Wall on existing plaster walls, dimensions still comply with WSF guidelines

- 8 courts = \$220,000, DLGSC Funding \$110,000, Tennis Club \$77,000, Melville Council \$11 \$22,000
- Jan 2024 - building approval to be provided by Melville Council - application is being pro
- Feb - Mar 2024 - all courts will be painted (side and back walls) professionally
- Mar 2024 - Court Designs will install the glass front walls by the 31st March
