2. Centre Improvement / Plans

Outdoor area - the BBQ has been upgraded with the new cabinets now in place. Fake lawn to t installed this weekend. Rob B working on some tables for the area, committee to look at some chairs. This will make the balcony area an attractive usable space.

Melville council have advised that the building will be painted in June/July as part of their ongoinaintenance schedule.

Court front walls - Mike Millington has repaired court 8 and this has held up well. There has be some further damage, and it appears that this will be an ongoing issue. Kane has a quote to re the remaining courts at \$4000-\$5000, plus painting, the issue is the ongoing maintenance requirements.

Kane advised that new 'tins' for the courts should be arriving next week, and then a process of changing them over with occur.

Possible plans for 2020:

- Install some locked cabinets under the noticeboard for storage of club merchandise and oth ${\mathfrak t}$ items

- Provide financial support to repair the front walls

- Work with Kane to finish off the kitchen space - holes in ceiling, space around the window, lig switch in the roof

Possible long term goals for the centre (note current fundraising will not fund these projects):

- Upgrade the courts to Court tech walls

- Air conditioning

3. Calendar of Events
